

Iranian held over forging of passports

KUALA LUMPUR: The Immigration Department busted a syndicate involved in forging documents and international passports following the arrest of an Iranian man last Wednesday. Immigration director-general Datuk Seri Khairul Dzaimie Daud said the 58-year-old suspect, believed to be the mastermind, was arrested on a business premises in Jalan Tuanku Abdul Rahman here. “The man has been living in Malaysia for more than 30 years using a social visit pass and is the husband of a local woman,” he said. The man was handing over forged documents to customers when the Immigration team arrested him. Further investigations led to another raid on an apartment in Bandar Baru Ampang, which was used as a place to falsify documents. **Bernama**
